

Achievement Award Spending Guidelines

The Achievement Award Scheme grant is designed to give <u>the winner</u> an opportunity to make a contribution to their organisation.

Do:

- Allow the award winner to decide how to spend their £250 grant
- Consult our "What can I spend my Achievement Award grant on?" poster and sample wish lists on our website for ideas about how they can spend their grant
- Enable young people to create their own wish list for your organisation so they can suggest items that would benefit or enhance their work
- Spend the grant as soon as possible and ideally by the end of the grant period
- Book and plan for activities or trips as soon as possible this is because we want the young people to enjoy the pride associated with the award in a timely manner
- Ensure that the grants benefit as many young people aged 11-25 years as possible
- Keep a record of the date of trips and numbers attending (we expect a group to benefit from the trip – not just one or two individuals)
- Keep a breakdown of any equipment purchased
- Ensure all equipment purchased remains the property of the organisation
- Allow a maximum of two winners to combine their awards if they both consent to doing so
- Keep receipts as you may be asked to supply these to us

Do Not:

- Spend the grant on everyday essential costs such as core equipment, regular staffing, expenses or running costs
- Donate the grant to an external organisation or charity (however, you can use the grant to organise a fundraising project to generate funds for a registered charity)
- 🗙 Repeatedly spend the grants on the same equipment
- 🗙 Spend the grant on alcohol, tobacco or anything illicit
- X Bank awards for future use

Grant on?

Here are some suggestions to help the winner decide how to spend their achievement award grant,

ltem for a specific activity:

- Table Tennis Table
- Games console
- Art Materials
- Sports Kit

Enhancing activities already on offer with new equipment:

- iPads
- New games for games console
- Printing Press
- Projector

Equipment for the organisation (must not be core costs):

- Novels for the library
- Sports equipment
- Outdoor Games
- Benches

Relating an event for a local community group that young people organise:

- Concert
- Play
- Fun day
- Fundraising event for a local charity

🤏 Hiring an external specialist:

- Specialist coach
- Author
- Guest Speaker
- Professional player

Training courses for young people that will ultimately benefit the wider organisation:

- Coaching Courses
- Referee Courses
- Peer Mentor Courses
- Enhancing an event:
 - DJ
 - Refreshments
 - Photo booth
 - Decorations
- Trips or special experiences:
 - Theatres, Museums or Cinema
 - Theme Parks
 - Training sessions in specialist venue e.g. Olympic Park
 - Residential trips
