The Jack Petchey Foundation

The Jack Petchey Foundation (JPF) exists to inspire and motivate young people across London and Essex and to recognise their achievements. It was set up in **1999** by **Sir Jack Petchey CBE**, with its now-famous Achievement Award scheme running in just three organisations in East London and now runs in over 1,400!

The Jack Petchey Foundation has had a direct impact on over 1 million young people since we first began.

At least **121,890** direct beneficiaries this year.

We have supported more than double the number of young people we reached the year before!

A Message from Our CEO

We are delighted to share our 2023 impact report with you and to celebrate the successes that we have had working closely with young people and with our partners. We overcame significant challenges this year* as we resumed our uplifting live celebration events and returned to wide-scale in-person delivery after the disruption of the pandemic.

We also celebrate the significant milestone of having **directly benefitted over 1 million young people in London and Essex** since Sir Jack set up the Foundation in 1999!

Our youth surveys last year highlighted just how many opportunities young people missed out on as a result of COVID-19. So, we focused on doing all that we could to support young people to re-connect with activities, launching new initiatives to help young people catch up on the things they missed and giving them new opportunities to be the best that they can be.



In both his business and philanthropic life, Sir Jack has always been focused on “what can we do better”? At the Foundation, we

continue this outlook and use monitoring and evaluation as a way to identify how we can further improve the opportunities we offer to young people.

None of our work would be possible without the dedication of our Achievement Award schools and youth organisations, our partners and our Youth Consultation Panel. Without your commitment, time and energy, the Foundation would not have been able to directly impact over 120,000 young people this year.

Impact Framework

Two years ago, we developed an impact framework to measure the difference we make across all of our work. This year, we focused our programmes, funding and initiatives on supporting people, organisations and young voices to build back stronger in three key areas:

1. Building self-confidence

This year, our programmes have made a significant difference by improving young people’s self-belief and confidence for the future. Self-confidence is an important outcome for us as we know that it is crucial for positive health and life outcomes, enabling people to ‘survive rather than thrive’. We’re delighted that 75% of young people participating in a JPF Partnership Programme over the year **have increased their confidence.**



2. Investing in resources and equipment for young people

Over the year, we not only aimed to support young people directly, but also worked to strengthen our partner organisations, clubs and schools to recover from the effects of the pandemic. One of the major ways we have done this is to invest our **Small Grants and Open Grants** in resources to support organisations to broaden their reach and deliver the best possible services and opportunities to young people post-covid, impacting young people long into the future.

3. Celebrating young voices

At the Jack Petchey Foundation we seek to recognise, celebrate and engage young people, and to give them a platform to share their ideas and their experiences. We do this through our unique celebration events, through regular youth surveys, by sharing young people’s voices and by working with our Youth Consultation Panel to ensure that all our work addresses young people’s needs in the best way possible, with new Jack Petchey Foundation initiatives designed *by young people for young people.*

Recognising young people and their leaders

The Jack Petchey Foundation was set up by Sir Jack Petchey CBE to inspire and motivate young people across London and Essex to do their best and reach their full potential.



The Achievement Award scheme, our flagship programme, recognises **young people's** achievements across London and Essex and as well as recognising the leaders organisations that support them.

- 11,139 young people recognised with Jack Petchey Achievement Awards
- 1,414 schools and clubs involved

- 89% agree that Jack Petchey Foundation programmes encourage young people to contribute positively to society

SPOTLIGHT ON

Achievement Award Grants



Each winner of a Jack Petchey Achievement Award is awarded a £300 grant to spend within their organisation to benefit their peers. In addition to the impact receiving an Achievement Award has on young people's own motivation, confidence and self-esteem, we love to see the direct impact the grant prize money has on young people, schools and organisations across London and Essex.

The Achievement Award winners themselves are key in deciding how their grants should be spent to benefit other young people around them. As a result, money is spent on a fantastic range of initiatives, including equipment, trips, training and more.

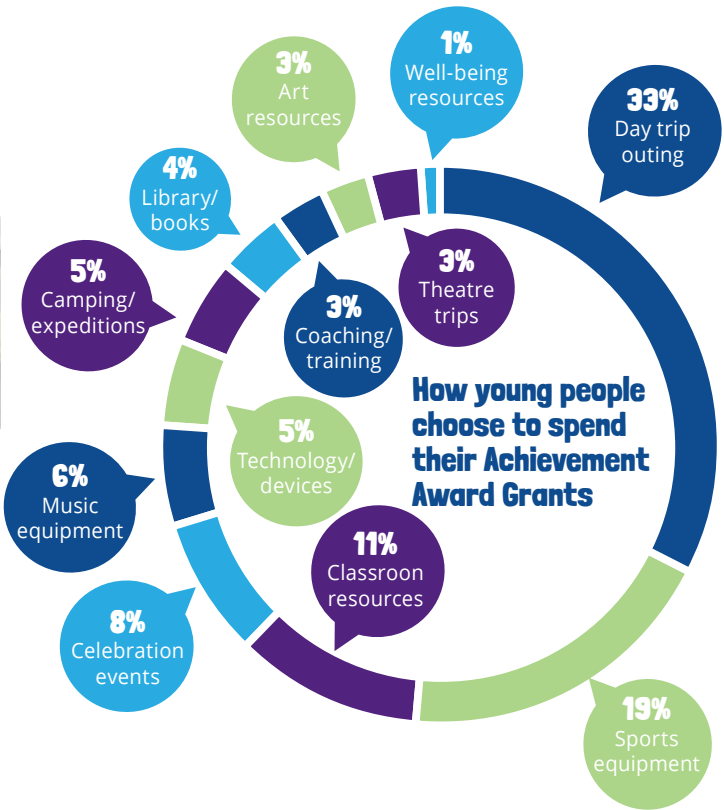
Case study

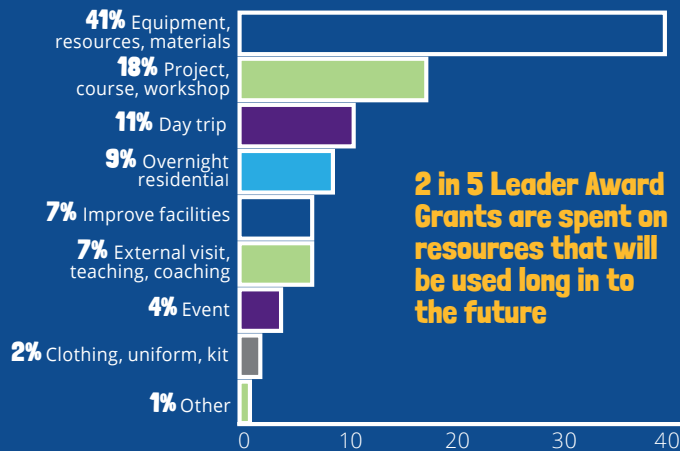

Leader Awards & Leader Award Grants



2 in 5 Leader Award Grants are spent on resources that will be used long in to the future

Leader Awards provide an opportunity for young people to thank the leaders, staff and volunteers that support them as they grow and develop. Giving a Leader Award also unlocks an opportunity for organisations to apply for a Leader Award Grant of up to £1,000 for a project that benefits young people.

SPOTLIGHT ON

Educational Visit Grants

10 years of funding trips for young people

Schools and youth groups on the Achievement Award scheme can apply twice a year for up to £1,200 to take young people on educational trips. This year, we doubled our Educational Visit Grants to £20 per head for up to 60 young people per trip.



We invested £22,035 in 70 Educational Visit Grants this year, benefitting 2,204 young people!

The Educational Visit Grants programme has been running for 10 years. Over that time, we have invested £192,923 through 444 schools and youth organisations giving 19,292 young people opportunities to visit museums, theatres, science shows and more to enrich their education and offer them opportunities to develop and grow outside of their usual environment.



Case study

Mossbourne Community Academy took 15 BTEC sports students studying outdoor activities to Brentwood Ski Centre. None of the students had previously experienced skiing, and the trip built their confidence and helped them develop new skills for working as a group.



SPOTLIGHT ON

The Jack Petchey Internship Programme

Supporting young talent and youth charities



The **Jack Petchey Internship Programme** funded 24 young people into paid 12-month placements in roles supporting young people. Our programme gives young people a flying start in the youth sector, supporting them on their way to become the sector's future leaders. At the same time, the programme enables youth organisations to increase the support they provide to young people across London and Essex. The programme includes up to 90% funding towards the intern's salary, a **£1,000 training bursary** for each intern, six professional development workshops and matching with a professional mentor to help the interns grow and develop their skills.

Case study

As part of the Youth Support team at Crystal Palace Community Trust (CPCT), Dylan worked to plan curriculum led programmes of activities for young people aged 11-25 in a range of settings. Dylan used his Personal Development Bursary from the Jack Petchey Foundation to achieve a football coaching qualification and a Level 3 qualification in Youth Work. Dylan has been offered a permanent role at CPCT once his internship finishes.

The Jack Petchey Foundation works in partnership with **16 organisations** to deliver tailored programmes for young people in London and Essex - **from dance to maths**, public speaking to financial education.

Our programmes are designed to **engage young people in new opportunities** and give them new skills to achieve their goals. This academic year marked a return to **wide-scale in-person delivery in schools and youth groups** after the disruption of the pandemic.

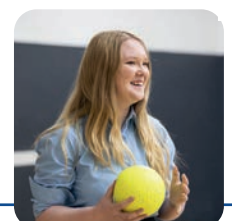

Panathlon's hybrid approach reaches more young people than ever!

Panathlon

Panathlon built on its virtual offer to schools and young people during the pandemic to offer a virtual offer for PE staff to integrate into their curriculum alongside a return to in-person inter-school sports competitions for children with disabilities. This new approach has enabled them to reach 1.5x as many young people as they had predicted.

- 12,201 young people took part this year
- 6,282 competitors
- 672 schools engaged
- 87% of teachers feel that Panathlon has built self-esteem and pride in young people taking part

Financial education

New Initiative: WizeUp with Jack Petchey

Our Financial Education programme, in partnership with WizeUp Financial Education, delivered financial education workshops to sixth-form schools in London and Essex with immense success in its first year. The programme was so positively received by schools and young people that we expanded it this academic year.

OUR RESPONSE

Bouncing Back Better

Emerging from the pandemic and the national lockdowns presented a variety of challenges for both young people as well as the schools, colleges and organisations that support and work with them. In response to this, in September 2021, we launched a new round of **Open Grants totalling over £800,000** for youth organisations in London and Essex, focused on funding **A Year of Opportunities** for young people. Organisations could use the funds to attract more young people into their services as well as to increase the services they provide.



Increased Engagement

“Through Relgnite, over 70% felt that their physical and mental well-being had improved. With only 13% of girls reporting being active [before the programme], this has had a positive impact on the health and well-being of young people.”

Theatre Peckham was awarded a Relgnite Grant of £14k to deliver outreach taster sessions to 370 young people in their programmes.

Many of the young people we support do not have access to activities available to their neurotypical peers. Benefits include reducing feelings of isolation, increasing confidence and improving social and life skills.”

Resources for Autism was awarded a Relgnite Grant of £13k to part fund a role and workshops to increase their reach, engaging 250 young people.



SPOTLIGHT: Reignite Grants

- ✓ Over 100 grants provided to re-ignite support for young people

Increased Confidence

“We saw growth in self-belief and confidence in the young people. ...We have taken a strength-based mentality and encourage young people to find and access opportunities that they may not have accessed before.”

Headliners was awarded a Relgnite Grant of £10k to support 63 young people to renovate outdoor spaces so that they work for young people.

Increased Attainment

“Young women have self-reported increased levels of confidence in Maths and Science. New participants have moved up ability sets in all the 3 core subjects – this has been evidenced by contact with schools.”

Westminster House Youth Club was awarded a Relgnite Grant of £12k to support 70 young people with well-being coaching and tuition.

“[The most significant benefit was] seeing some of our most challenged young people progressing into education that they'd previously felt unattainable and the pride it brings to their parents.”

Haringey Shed was awarded a Relgnite Grant of £10k to deliver a volunteer programme to 80 young people.

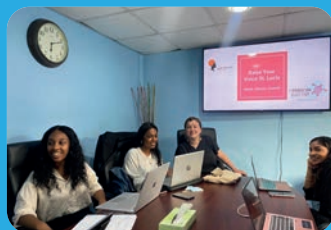


Empowering young people to give back!

We were delighted to relaunch our popular **Individual Grants for Volunteering** this year, following a pause due to COVID and associated travel restrictions. Young people can apply directly to the Foundation for up to **£400** towards their **volunteering project** in the UK or abroad.

The relaunch was extremely popular, with 56 individuals volunteering at **18 different organisations in the UK** and abroad this year, through a total Jack Petchey Foundation investment of **£10,440**.

Many have applied for funding for projects that they will take part in next year.



Case study

Whale Conservation in Iceland!

Jessica, 23, used her Individual Grant for Volunteering to fund a project in Iceland to assess humpback entanglements and health issues with the organisation Whale Wise.

Getting young people into the great outdoors



This year, we ran an **Environmental Youth Survey** (more on page 16). Over half of those surveyed said they would like to see more trips into nature for young people to help them engage with the environment and give them new opportunities after COVID.

We partnered with **London Youth and Essex Boys and Girls Clubs** to offer the chance of an overnight residential in the **great outdoors** for young people from across London and Essex. For many young people, this was the first time they had stayed away from home overnight or been away with their peers.

Investing in the Environment for Young People

The Jack Petchey Environmental Award – recognising the green leaders of tomorrow

Following COP26 in 2021, we launched an Environmental Youth Survey to ensure that young people were heard in conversations around the environment and to determine what should be done to support young people to build a greener tomorrow.



✓ **3,896** young people gave their views and ideas

One of the top recommendations from the survey was that young people should be recognised more for helping the environment (**47%**), so we launched the **Jack Petchey Environmental Award**, where members of the public could nominate a young person they know who is making a positive impact on the environment for special recognition. Winners are awarded a **special certificate**, badge, letter from Sir Jack Petchey and the opportunity to apply for an **environmental grant of £300** to further their environmental work.

Case studies



Yasmine, 14 from Hammersmith and Fulham, was awarded a Jack Petchey Environmental Award for organising a team of students to plant greenery and encourage others to grow their own food, as well as creating a mental-health space for students to enjoy. Yasmin went on to apply for and be awarded a Jack Petchey Environmental Grant of £300 to further invest in this space by purchasing the equipment to build a school allotment.

Finn, 16 from Southwark, was awarded a Jack Petchey Environmental award for his work volunteering with Surrey Docks City Farm. Finn independently established a partnership between the London Wildlife Trust and London Youth to deliver a nature awareness day for the local community at Surrey Docks Farm.

This year marked the tenth anniversary of our prestigious **Achiever Network programme**, a 12-month self-development programme for around **30 young people** each year. We marked the occasion by reuniting representatives from across the ten cohorts to celebrate the power of young people and their voices.

We continue to be driven by Sir Jack Petchey's vision, and are committed to achieving this by investing in young people and youth organisations across London and Essex, supporting them to be the best they can be and building a brighter future for us all.
