- The shortlisted entries will be judged by a panel of young people working closely with the Jack Petchey Foundation

The Judging Process

- The Jack Petchey Foundation will shortlist the top entries, who will then be judged by a panel of young people affiliated working closely with the Jack Petchey Foundation.
- The winner will be contacted directly by email in May, and shared on social media alongside any runners up.
- All entries that will be posted on the Jack Petchey Foundation social media will be directly contacted before posting to confirm permission and consent.

The panel of judges will score against the following criteria:

Suitability (25%)

Creativity (25%)

An original concept executed in a creative way that stands out from other entries

Execution (25%)

- A well-executed, thought-out and engaging piece of creative work that encapsulates the theme effectively

Overall Likeability (25%)

- Overall appeal of the piece as a creative expression of the future
