The Jack Petchey Foundation is officially established

Since 1999, the Jack Petchey Foundation has invested **over £170m** in programmes and partnerships, directly benefitting **over 1,170,000** young people aged 11-25 across London and Essex. We recognise achievement, champion young voices, build self-belief, confidence and skills, and expand opportunities for new experiences.



RECOGNISING YOUNG PEOPLE AND THEIR LEADERS



Over 235,000 young people have been recognised with a **Jack Petchey Achievement Award** within schools and youth organisations in London and Essex.

Our Achievement Award Coordinators running the scheme in schools and youth organisations report that JPF programmes have increased young people's confidence, recognised their achievements, raised their aspirations and motivated them to "give back" to society.

The Jack Petchey Achievement Award Scheme annually invests **£3.5m**. This funding is invested in equipment, experiences and extra-curricular opportunities that further benefit young people at schools and youth clubs on the scheme.

The Jack Petchey Leader Award recognises the incredible commitment of adults who support young people. The award gives young people an opportunity to nominate, appreciate and thank their leaders.

The grant spends create ripples of impact by allowing schools and youth organisations to support even more young people.



Jack Petchey's Community Awards and Jack Petchey's Lockdown School Heroes recognised 145 young people and leaders for helping their communities during the lockdown.



AMPLIFYING YOUNG VOICES

The Jack Petchey Foundation values young people and those who work with them, advocating their views and putting their voices at the centre of our work.

Thousands of Jack Petchey Achievement Award events have been held to celebrate and recognise young people, as well as raise awareness of their value and achievements.

Almost 2.6 million people have attended our celebration events over the past 25 years.



Twelve young people make up **The Jack Petchey Youth Consultation Panel**. They work with us to ensure that our programmes, events, grants and initiatives have the greatest possible impact. Our Board of Trustees includes a youth member from the Panel.





DEVELOPING YOUNG PEOPLE'S CONFIDENCE AND SELF-BELIEF

Over 25 years we have partnered with **22** different organisations, engaging at least **780,000** young people in our Partner Programmes.

The impact of our Partner Programmes on young people as a result of participation over the past year is:

Our partners have also trained almost **22,000** young leaders, teachers or facilitators. Their improved skills and capabilities benefit all those they work with. Of these teachers/leaders, **40%** have developed new ideas and approaches that have changed their organisations, widening the ripples of JPF's impact.

EXPANDING YOUNG PEOPLE'S EXPERIENCES

The Jack Petchey Internship Programme

has funded **122** interns since 2018, kick-starting their careers in the youth and charity sectors and developing their professional skills, confidence and resilience. As a result of the internships,

the organisations they work for gain an additional and valuable resource and can support thousands more young people.

5,400 young people benefitted from **27 COVID Recovery Grants** that supported organisations to survive, adapt and thrive.



The Achiever Network is our personal development programme. It has helped **318** young people aged 14–19 develop their confidence, self-esteem and a range of skills.

To promote a culture of 'giving something back', over **5,250 Individual Grants for Volunteering** have been awarded. In total, **£1.3m** has been invested to enable young people to volunteer with projects in more than 60 different countries, benefitting communities and supporting their own personal development.




JPF has invested over **£677,000** in **Educational Visit Grants**. This has supported schools and youth organisations to allow thousands of young people to attend museums, theatres, science shows and other experiences they otherwise would not have had the opportunity to.

100+ Relignite Grants supported almost **19,000** young people after the COVID pandemic by funding **A Year of Opportunities** that supported organisations to increase their reach and services provided.
