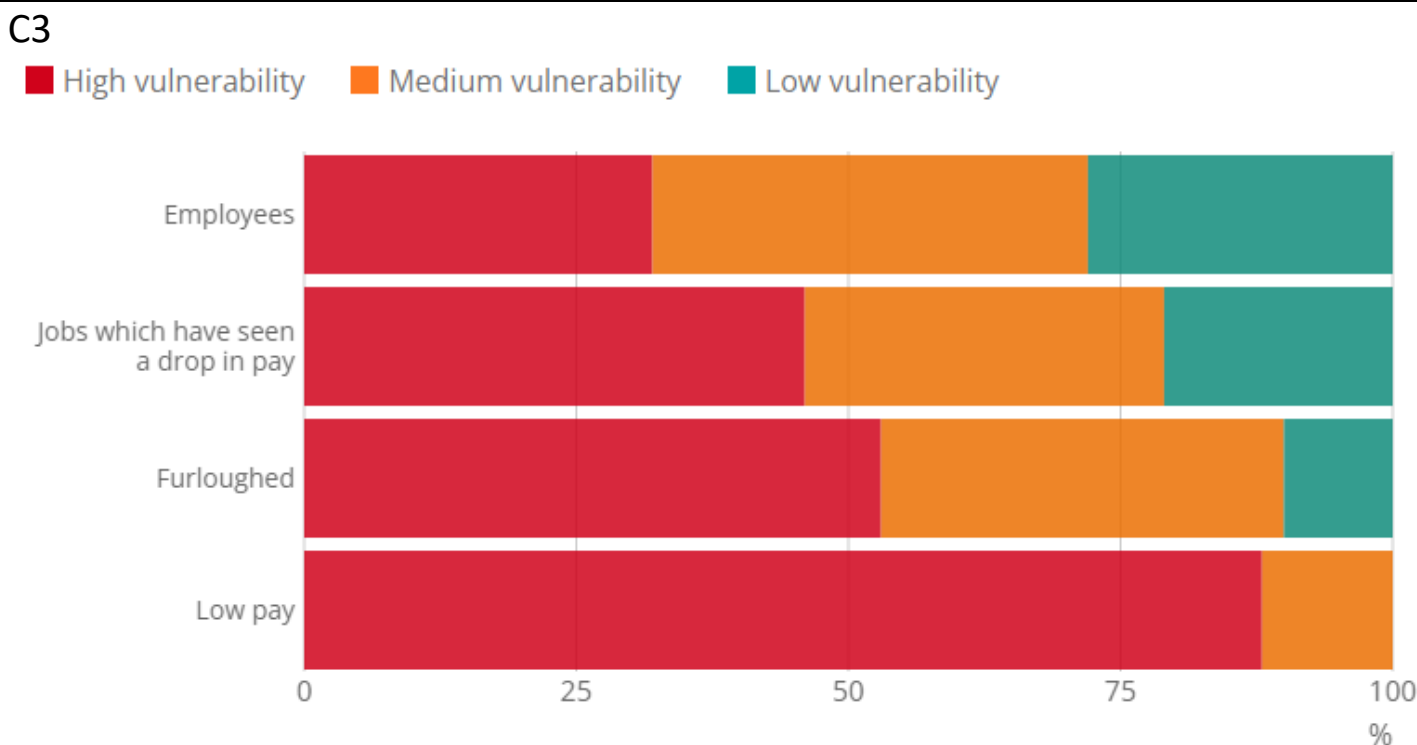


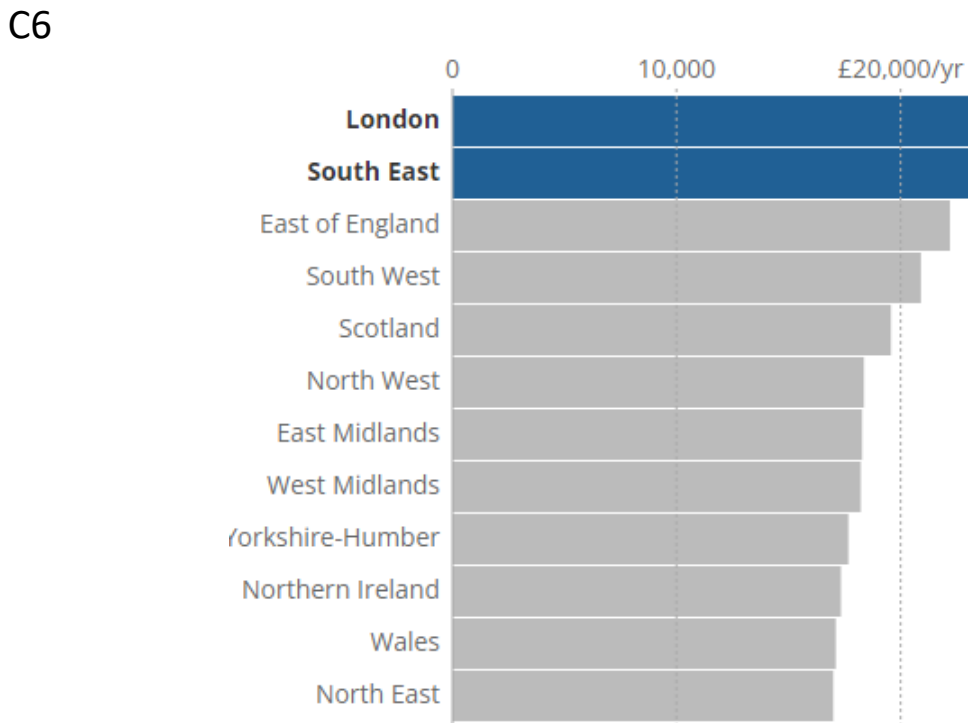

2018

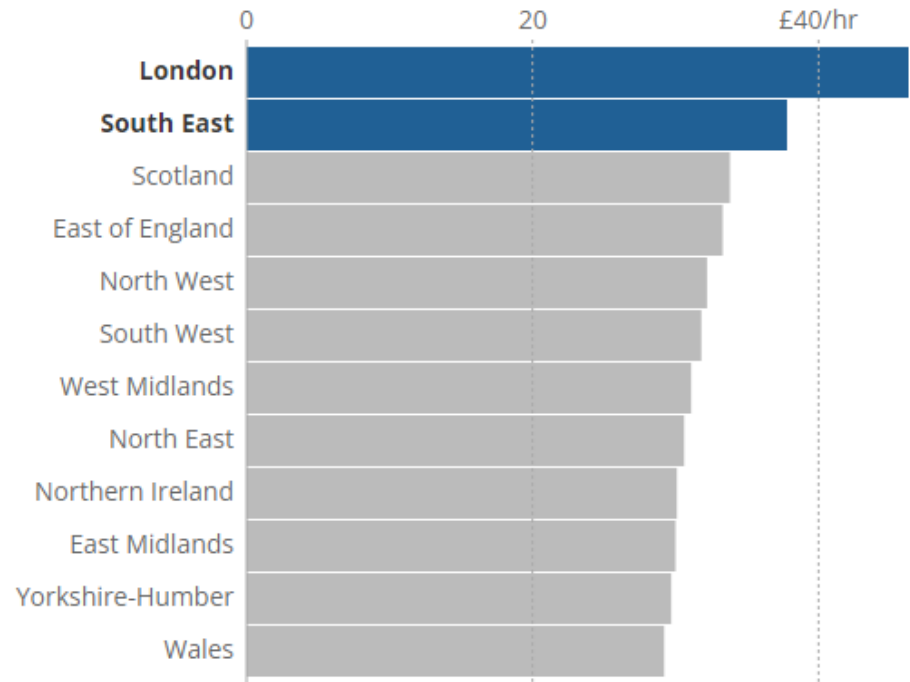

worked), 2018

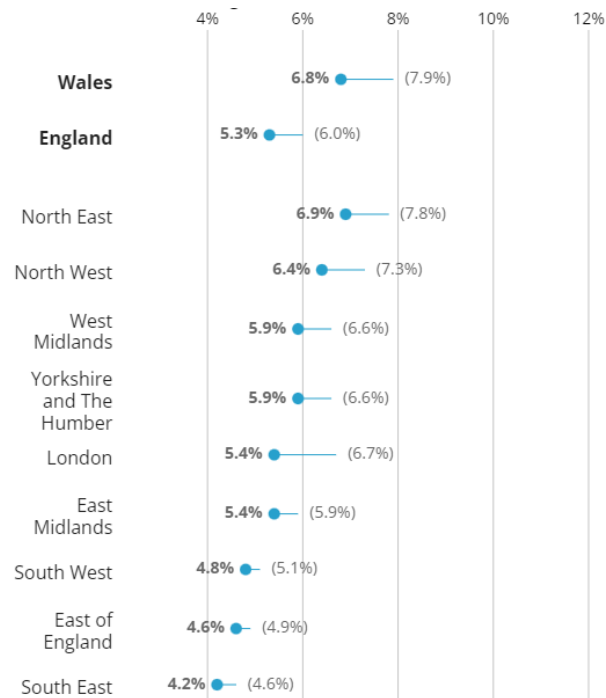

Age-standardised percentage of people providing unpaid care by hours of care provided, England and Wales, 2021

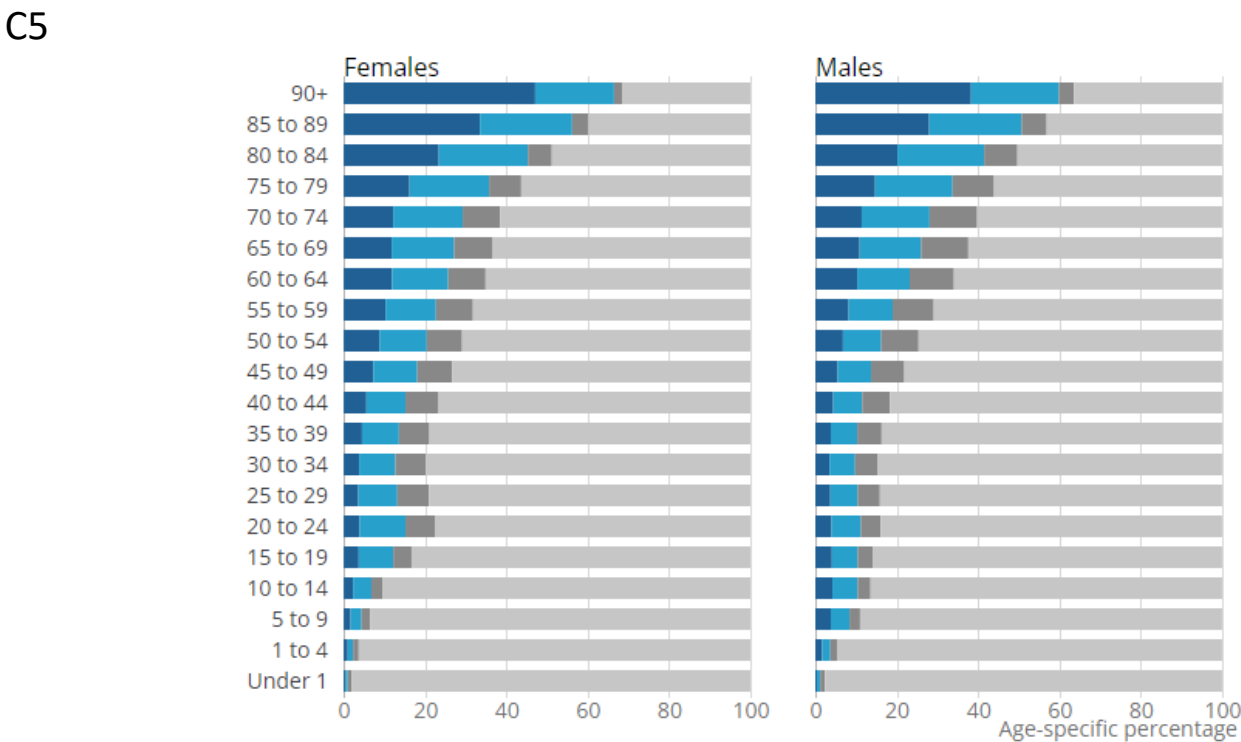
