

# Educational Visits and Learning Experiences Grant

Sir Jack believed that young people should have every opportunity to get out and about in their community to learn something new.

Our Educational Visits and Learning Experiences Grant exist to make trips more accessible and affordable for schools and youth organisations.

## TRIPS SHOULD HELP YOUNG PEOPLE TO:

- ✿ Access new experiences and environments
- ✿ Foster teamwork, confidence, resilience or leadership
- ✿ Experience art, culture, nature or sport
- ✿ Support personal growth or learn something new
- ✿ Learn from experts



## WHAT WE CAN FUND:

- ✓ Travel and accommodation costs
- ✓ Entry fees or ticket
- ✓ Camping or residential bookings
- ✓ Up to two staff places (at the same value as the young person allowance)

For **SEND groups, PRUs and Alternative Provisions**, we may consider a higher per head funding allowance if you'll incur additional costs to run the trip, such as:

- ✓ Additional staff tickets, hire of specialist transport, accessibility modifications

## WHAT WE CAN'T FUND:

- ✗ Food or refreshments
- ✗ Annual memberships or subscriptions (e.g. football league fees)

**Please note...** If your trip is mainly for fun or social activities, our Achievement Award or Leader Award Grants may be more suitable (such as theme parks, ice skating, bowling, trampolining).

**This grant is not currently available to our uniformed organisations.**

# IDEAS FOR TRIPS TO INSPIRE YOU:

- ★ Theatre, plays, musical theatre, pantomime
- ★ One-off sports participation and competitions (karate open courses, swimming galas, show jumping)
- ★ Outdoor adventures (camping, residentials, seaside visits)
- ★ Art Galleries, Museums and Libraries
- ★ Challenging team activities (high ropes)
- ★ Professional sports match (if linked to your organisation's club sport)
- ★ University Open Days
- ★ Tours of national or local landmarks
- ★ Nature-based trips (city farms, zoos and aquariums)
- ★ Expert or instructor-led guided sessions such as:
  - River clean-ups
  - Bushcraft workshops / Forest School
  - Boat or canal trips
  - Kayaking or sailing
  - Climbing wall or bouldering
  - Cookery masterclass

## ON-SITE EXPERIENCES:

### For SEND, PRU, and Alternative Provisions (APs) only

These settings may host on-site educational experiences if travel is difficult for your young people.

Examples include:

- ★ Guest or Expert Speaker (inc. authors, senior sports leader)
- ★ Workshops
- ★ Mobile zoos or animal on-site visits
- ★ Visiting theatre groups

## KEY FUNDING DETAILS:

- ✿ **£20** per head (mainstream trips/residentials)
- ✿ Up to **£60** per head for trips (SEND, PRUs and APs)
- ✿ Up to **£100** per head for residentials (SEND, PRUs and APs)
- ✿ Maximum grant for any application (all organisations): **£1,200**
- ✿ Maximum applications: **2 per Achievement Award Scheme**, per calendar year



## HOW TO APPLY:

**1. Log into the JPF Community Area**

**2. On the right-hand side, click "Click here to apply for grants."**

**3. Confirm all trip details, including:**

1. Date of trip
2. Full cost breakdown
3. Educational and learning benefit of the trip

**4. You will be notified within 21 days if your trip has been approved or rejected, or if we have any follow up questions.**

**Please do not book your trip until you hear from us.**

**5. Go on the trip and support your young people to share what they've learnt afterwards.**

**6. Complete the report and provide the receipts within 7 days of the trip in your report found under "due requirements" in the Community Area.**

**7. The Jack Petchey Foundation will check the report and receipts. Once approved, we will arrange to pay the grant to your organisation.**
