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Grant Opportunities

In addition to our Achievement Award Scheme, we also have grant funding available to provide opportunities for young people at your organisation. Please see a summary of our grant opportunities below.

The Jack Petchey Achievement Award Scheme

Our flagship programme, the Jack Petchey Achievement Award Scheme, recognises outstanding young people aged 11-25 across London and Essex. This grant programme recognises young people for their achievements with a certificate, pin badge and a grant of £300 to be spent within their organisation. The young person decides how to spend this grant in a way that benefits other young people at their youth group, school or college. Winners are also presented with a medallion at one of our Achievement Award Events. Applications can be submitted at any time. Apply online or contact us at the Jack Petchey Foundation.



Environmental Award

The Environmental Award recognises young people for their work around climate issues and sustainability within their organisations or the local community. Organisations can nominate one winner per scheme, per year. Winners receive a certificate and hand-made wooden award, presented at our Achievement Award Events, and can apply for an Environmental Award Grant. Applications can be submitted via the Community Area. **



Environmental Award Grant

The Environmental Award Grant allows organisations to apply for up to £300 to contribute to the environmental work they do with young people. This can support a project that enhances green initiatives and contributes to protecting our planet. Eligible organisations must have received an Environmental Award in the last six months. Apply via a link on the award approval email. **



Educational Visits and Learning Experiences Grant

This grant helps to fund inspiring, learning opportunities for young people to try new experiences, grow and build confidence – through culture, nature, sport, creativity, teamwork or personal challenge. The grant offers up to £1,200 towards tickets, transport and/or accommodation for eligible day/residential trips across the UK. Funding up to £20 per young person (up to £60 for day trips or up to £100 for overnight residentials for SEND schools and SEND registered youth organisations). Organisations can apply to cover the costs of up to 2 accompanying adults at the young people's rate. Applications can be submitted via the Community Area. **



Leader Award

The Leader Award recognises inspiring adults aged 18+ who go above and beyond to support young people in schools and youth organisations. Organisations can nominate one adult leader per scheme, per year. Once approved, the Leader Award winner is eligible to apply for a Leader Award Grant. Applications can be submitted via the Community Area.

Young Enterprise Employability Workshops

Young Enterprise helps young people understand the skills they need for future employment. We support three programmes: **Employability Masterclass** focuses on core employability skills such as CV writing, interview preparation, and goal setting; **Launchpad** offers young people the opportunity to set up a business, encouraging entrepreneurial thinking and teamwork; **Learn to Earn** explores the link between education and future careers, helping students understand how their choices today can shape their future opportunities.

In partnership with WizeUp Financial Education, WizeUp with Jack Petchey is designed to improve sixth form students' understanding of personal finance to help them make positive decisions on money after they leave school. Students in Year 12 and 13 receive 60-75 minute tuition sessions delivered over 4 workshops, covering crucial topics such as budgeting, credit cards and student finance. Workshops are available to students in Years 10 and 11 for those in schools that do not have a sixth form.

Opportunities for Young People

The Achiever Network

The Achiever Network is a free 12-month personal development programme run by the Jack Petchey Foundation. It supports eligible Jack Petchey award winners and partnership programme participants aged 14–19 (or up to 21 for young people with SEND) to build self-awareness, confidence and new skills. Through a residential trip, five Saturday training days, mentoring and shared experiences with other young people, participants are encouraged to step outside their comfort zone, learn from new opportunities and meet new people.
