

Jack Petchey's Forward to the Future Competition

Terms and Conditions

Entering the Competition

- The competition will launch on Monday 19th July 2021
- Any individual or group of individuals between the ages of 11-19 can enter from London or Essex
- The piece entered can span any art form, so long as it can be submitted digitally either via the website or via Wetransfer. The piece entered must be completely original and fit into the theme, the Jack Petchey Foundation's ethos and young people inspiring the future. It must be an uplifting/positive exploration of the future, specifically of life in 96 years' time (the year 2117).
- There are limits to certain art forms:
 - o Videos or pieces of music entered must be a maximum of 4 minutes
 - o Written pieces entered must be a maximum of 1500 words
 - o Any photos entered must be in jpg .jpeg .png format, with a max file size of 4 MB.
- All works entered must be completely original and created by the person/people entering them
- The winning entry will receive a £500 artistic development grant to be spent to help them pursue their chosen art forms. This grant can be spent on equipment, lessons/a course or visiting an event to further the young person's artistic endeavours. Prizes for runners up will also be awarded.
- If the winning entry is created by a group of young people, the £500 prize will be split evenly between the individuals in the group.
- All shortlisted entries will be featured at an exhibition organised by the Jack Petchey Foundation which will run either online or both online and in person, a live exhibition will be dependent on any restrictions or potential safety issues at the time.
- The entrants must upload their entry via the online form at jackpetcheyfoundation.org.uk. If their entry exceeds the file size able to be uploaded on the form, they must send their file via wetransfer.com to jpfcompetitions@jackpetchey.org.uk AND submit the web form with the required information.

- The organisers will acknowledge receipt of all applications within 72 hours of receiving them, so please contact us if you have not heard within that time.
- Entries will close at 5pm on Thursday 30th September 2021

The Judging Process

- The Jack Petchey Foundation and a selected panel of young people will shortlist the top entries, who will be notified by the 1st November 2021. Winners and runners up will be notified by the Jack Petchey Foundation. The winner and runner-up entries will be posted on the Jack Petchey's Social Media and website.
- Those shortlisted entrants will then be invited to the Jack Petchey Foundation's Forward to the Future exhibition, which will either take place online or both online and in person.
- All prize funds will be awarded at a mutually agreed time and will be subject to the approval of the Jack Petchey Foundation terms of use as stated above (*to be spent to help them pursue their chosen art forms. This grant can be spent on equipment, lessons/a course or visiting an event to further the young person's artistic endeavours*)

The winning entry will be required to sign the rights of the piece over to the Jack Petchey Foundation as part of the competition entry

The organisers reserve the right to update these terms and conditions at any time and will make every effort to communicate any changes as soon as possible

Judging Criteria

The panel of judges will score against the following criteria:

Suitability (25%)

- Appropriate for our target audience; exploring an inspirational, positive and motivational vision of life in 96 years' time

Creativity (25%)

- An original concept executed in a creative way that stands out from other entries

Execution (25%)

- A well-executed, thought-out and engaging piece of creative work that encapsulates the theme effectively

Overall Likeability (25%)

- Overall appeal of the piece as a creative expression of the future

Safeguarding Policy

The competition is open to applications from individuals or groups of young people aged 11-19 from London and Essex.

All entrants are required to provide their full contact details, including email and telephone number, and must give their consent for their personal details to be used as part of their competition entry. If entrants are under 16, permission will need to be granted by a parent or carer.

A shortlist of candidates will be drawn for the exhibition, and winners contacted separately to organise their prizes. An email will be sent to each shortlisted candidate and their parent/guardian in advance of the online or in person exhibition, detailing the time, location, persons present and organisation of the planned exhibition (if under 16, permission to attend the exhibition must be submitted in writing to the Jack Petchey Foundation by a parent or guardian). The winner and runners up will be contacted at this same time to congratulate them and to arrange their cash-prize and what this will be spent on.

If the Jack Petchey Foundation have a safeguarding concern during the competition or exhibition, they will raise it with the Foundation's designated Safeguarding Officer directly.

All JPF staff are required to have a DBS completed.
